This academic year there are currently 163 children in our school taking part in extra-curricular activities outside of teaching time, 56 of which attend clubs that promote health including sport, dance and healthy eating. We have regular meetings with management to ensure that the clubs are fulfilling their potential and have enough attendees. We also welcome feedback from the children at St Peter's to inform us about what clubs we may want to offer in the future. We will continue to bring new ideas of keeping fit into St Peter's to ensure that children remain motivated

and interested in keeping fit. Here are some comments from the children about PE and sport at St Peter's "I like the way everyone tries their best no matter what PE session we are doing." "I like learning new skills and using teamwork." "Lacrosse is a new sport to all of us, so everything our coach teaches us is new. Whether it's the 3 (step, squat, scoop) or cradling."
