Nursery News

I would like to start by wishing all our families a very Happy New Year. The children have all returned with a very positive learning attitude and ready for the busy term ahead. Our topic this half term is 'Journeys'. Our first story will be 'We're going on a Bear Hunt' by Michael Rosen and Helen Oxenbury, followed by 'The Train Ride' by June Crebbin. Children will be encouraged to talk about journeys that they have taken and name some of the things that they have seen on the way. They will also learn about positional language using words like under, over, up and on top. Throughout this term we will continue to listen to stories, singing nursery rhymes, learning to recognise numbers 1-10, counting a number of objects, counting forwards and backwards, recognising and copying our names. These are all things that children should be practising at home. In RE we will be listening to stories that Jesus heard and also listening to stories that Jesus told others, for example 'The creation story'. Children will learn how God created the world in 6 days and what he created on each day. Children will be asked to bring in their own favourite stories to share with their friends in Nursery. We will continue to send a 'home learning challenge' each week and this term we will also be sending home a weekly library book for the children to share with their family. Reading with your children in very important as they learn new words and improve their literacy skills. If you have any questions, please do not hesitate to speak to any of the Nursery team. Reception News



Year 1 News

Welcome back to another fun filled half term, we hope you hope you had a great break, making lots of memories together and are ready for another exciting half term in Reception! This half term our topic is 'Journeys', we will start by learning about a winter journey in 'One Winter's Day', recognising the changes that happen in winter and learning new vocabulary such as 'hibernation'. We will then move onto the story 'The Naughty Bus', before exploring in space in 'Whatever Next' and looking at some non-fiction books relating to the Moon. The children will be having lots of fun learning about Winter as we go on our half termly season walk. The children are hoping we also get some snow to play in! In Maths we will be learning our number bonds in a variety of different ways to encourage the children to explore these practically. We will also begin to describe 3D shapes and notice them in our environment both indoors and outside. This half term our RE topic is Stories Jesus heard and told, this will include listening to different parables such as Noah's Ark, The Two Builders Parable and the story of Baby Moses. We will be acting out the stories in order to explore their deeper meaning. Please continue to encourage your child to use their phonics when reading at home, we are super impressed with how the children are doing.

Welcome back and Happy New Year! We have got lots of interesting and exciting things planned over the next few weeks in Year One. In RE this term we will be looking at our new topic of 'Jesus was special'. This will involve us looking at his life and ministry. Over the course of this topic children will come to understand what made Jesus special, who Jesus's close friends and followers were and all of the different miracles that Jesus performed throughout his life. We will be learning all about people and their communities in Geography and discovering new information about various cities and islands from around the world. In Art we will be looking at the topic of 'tackling textiles' and will be developing skills such as weaving. In Science we are going to be learning about humans and animals, comparing the similarities and differences and developing an understanding of our own body's and our life cycle. In English we will be reading traditional tales, funny poems, letters and learning to write instructions. This term we are going to be focusing on using adjectives and verbs in our writing to make our sentences more interesting. We are going to continue building our knowledge of number in Maths, including place value, addition, subtraction and number sequences. We will also learn more about time and money and begin measuring lengths and weights. Please come and speak to one of the team if you need anything.



Year 2 News



Welcome back to the Spring term! In maths, we will begin by focusing on the properties of numbers and then move onto fractions of amounts. Would you rather have half a cake or a quarter? We will also be doing a weekly 'MAD MINUTES' sessions, where the children are timed whilst completing their times tables. Ready, steady, get practising! In English, we are focusing on the book 'The Dragon Machine' by Helen Ward. The children will be making predictions, exploring unfamiliar words, ordering the events of the story and answering comprehension questions. Towards the end of this half term, we will be looking at instructions. In Geography, our topic is 'Where does our food come from? 'Throughout this topic, we will be exploring how food is made and the process of how our food gets to the shops from farms. What is used to make bread? Our Science topic is 'Animals including Humans'. We will look at the life cycles of different animals and explore the different organs in our bodies. In RE, we will be focusing on the topic 'The Bible'. Our learning will be focused around many 'Big Questions' and we will be discussing how the Bible is separated into two sections - the Old Testament and the New Testament.

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Year 3 News

Welcome back and Happy New Year! We hope you have had a relaxing time and are refreshed as we have lots of interesting and exciting things planned over the next few weeks in Year 3. In RE our topic is "Jesus - The man who changed lives". We will be looking at important changes we have faced in our lives and reflecting on how this may change us as a person. We will be looking at the impact of Jesus on the world and individual's lives. How he helped them, how he changed them, how he saved them. Maths will see us continuing with important skills such as place value, recognising 3-digit numbers addition and subtraction as well as multiplication, division facts. Please continue to practise times tables at home as much as possible and encourage your children to access their Times Table Rock Stars accounts as a way of making this fun for them. In English we will be exploring fiction stories including imaginary worlds where we will be looking at the book 'Fantastic Mr Fox'. The children will write character descriptions and then write their own version of the story. We will also be looking at Greek myths and legends. This is a very exciting selection of topics as it involves a lot of the children's creativity and imagination. Science this half term is focusing on Animals including Humans. We will be looking at food, how we use it and what it does for our bodies and for other animals' bodies. In Geography, we are learning about climates around the world! We will learn about types of climate: temperate, desert, polar and tropical. We will also be creating our own 'triorama' of climates! Our Art topic this term will focus on investigating patterns in textiles and from different times and culture. The focus will be Islamic patterns. We will be looking at the intricacies of these patterns and how they are created. PE is on Tuesday, Thursday and Friday. Please make sure your child has their PE kit in school on these days.

Year 4 News



Year 5 News

Welcome back in 2023! We are looking forward to some exciting topics and learning opportunities. The first term went by in a flash and this Spring term will go by very quickly too and hopefully by the end we will be back to some more familiar routines. The first half of the term in Geography, Year 4 will be 'Investigating Rivers' which links in our first Science unit of 'States of Matter'. In Science, we have the first of three biology units: Animals including Humans. This is a very hand on topic where children study the human digestive system and human and animal teeth this builds on work in Year 3 on human nutrition, the skeleton system and muscle groups. In RE, we will be exploring Jesus as the Son of God, looking at the many wondrous acts Jesus performed. In English, we will be starting with instructions and explanations before moving onto a story that finds the character in need of our help... Multiplication and division will be a big focus for the start of this half term. This knowledge helps us to work with other concepts later on with more ease due to the speed at which we can recall these facts. Later this half term, we will begin to explore fractions. Swimming continues right on through the Spring and Summer terms and looks to consolidate the progress made in the Autumn lesson. PE in school is continuing with Games and Gymnastics. Please can you ensure that your child has their PE kit in school on Thursdays. Thank you for your continued support.

Happy New Year! Hope you all had a lovely break and are ready to start 2023! We have some fantastic topics to learn about across lots of different subjects this term. In English, we will begin the term by looking at spooky stories and writing for this genre. We will then look at forming an argument for or against different topics. And finally, we will become detectives to solve the mystery of some very unusual events, writing our reports on our findings! In Maths, alongside the revisiting of place value and the four operations, we will be looking at shape for the first time in Year 5. We will deepen our understanding of 3D shapes and investigate the properties of polygons. Our science unit will cover animals including humans. Exploring habitats and how they develop as they grow older. For RE we will be focusing on Women in the Old Testament and how different women had very important roles to play and how we can relate and use their examples and values into our own lives. Our Geography our topic is 'Where should we go on holiday?' Looking into the Alpine region of Europe including tectonic plates and the formation of mountains! In Art the children will be looking at containers as historical and practical items and how they have been used as an expression of art, eventually learning techniques and using examples for inspiration to create their own special container. May I remind you that although Year 5 are scheduled to have indoor PE on a Tuesday and Wednesday and outdoor PE on a Friday, kit should be in school at all times in case on any last-minute changes. The same applies to reading books - if you have any questions, please do speak to one of the team. Thank you.



Year 6 News



Welcome back after the Christmas break! In English, we will be focusing on different genres of writing where the children have the opportunity to edit and redraft their work; ensuring each piece of writing shows their true potential. We will start by looking at villains in poetry, thinking about writing our own version of 'The Spider and the Fly'. We will then be moving onto 'Goodnight Mr. Tom'. We will be reading the story in class and basing our writing around it. We will be using the thoughts and feelings of the characters to produce our writing. We will then move on to looking at information texts based on evacuees. In Maths, we will begin with rounding and thinking about measurements. Then we will move onto looking at fractions and percentages of amounts. Children will be taking part in Freckles and answer questions that are marked automatically and then are tested at the end. We will continue with the competition between the classes on TT Rock stars, and we will see which class wins just before the end of the term. In Science, we will be looking at 'Animals including Humans'. Children will get the opportunity to observe how the human body works and how blood moves around the body. In Geography, the topic we are looking at is 'Are we damaging our world?' We will be learning about how our actions are affecting the world globally. In Art, we will be focusing on Monet and looking at 'What can you see?' The Christian Value we will explore is 'Courage'. This half term, we will be focusing on significant events around the world, the children will be answering Big Questions and posing their own. We are looking forward to another exciting term with Year 6!
