This academic year we have increased the number of sports clubs we are currently running as extra-curricular activities. There are now six different after school sports clubs taking place with termly rotations of the choice of

sports on offer. There is an average of 120 pupils attending the sports clubs each term. Melissa Kyte (PE Coordinator) and Nicola Meredith (Extra-Curricular Coordinator) meet regularly to ensure attendance of pupils and the sports on offer are appropriate to the local competitions. We also welcome feedback from the children at St Peters to inform us about what clubs they would like us to offer in the future. We will continue to bring new ideas of keeping fit into St Peters to ensure that children remain motivated and interested in their physical health. Here are some comments from the children about P.E and sport at St Peter's "I like the way everyone tries their best no matter what P.E session we are doing." "I like learning new skills and using teamwork." "Lacrosse is a new sport to all of us, so everything our coach teaches us is new. Whether it's the 3 (step, squat, scoop) or cradling."
