

STEM links the subjects of science, technology, engineering and maths together; this gives children the opportunity to greatly enjoy building knowledge through some amazing activities and projects. Within this special week children were given a different challenge linked to travel through, or using, the air. This promoted their problem-solving skills; the children used their knowledge of all four subjects and logical thinking to create their masterpieces. It was great fun!

Nursery News

We would like to start by welcoming all our families back after the half term holiday and we hope that you had a restful break! We have a busy term ahead as the children get ready for transition into Reception. Our new topic this term is called 'Superheroes'. The first book that we will be looking at is 'The Flying Bath' by Julia Donaldson. This is about an amazing bath that can actually fly and helps people in need. In this story we will be looking at what speech bubbles are and we will be writing our own speech bubbles. We will also be making our own books about the characters. In RE we are starting the topic 'How God Created the World", we will be thinking about how God created all the wonderful things, including us! We will be retelling the creation story using musical instruments. We will also be thinking about our families and the different people we know and how they help us. Throughout the term we will be listening to stories, singing nursery rhymes, learning to recognise numbers, counting a number of objects, counting forwards and backwards. We will also be listening to the sounds we can hear at the beginning of words and learning how to write them. These are all things that children should be practising at home! We will continue to send your children home. with a weekly home learning challenge, please complete the tasks in this book each week. This will help to improve the children's learning further. If you have any questions regarding your child's learning, please do not hesitate to speak to any of the Nursery staff. We are always happy to help.




Year 1 News

Welcome back to our last half term in Reception! We hope you had a lovely break and enjoyed making memories as a family; we love hearing about all of the wonderful things the children have been up to. We are super excited for our final trip of the year to 'Imagine That!' You will see what a great time we have on the website gallery. This half term our topic is ... Superheroes! We will start the half term with the story 'Supertato', in this story an Evil Pea is on the loose, can we help catch him?! The children will be making their own traps, labelling them and also writing sentences about how they work! We will then move onto 'There Is No Dragon in This Story', where we might see characters that we recognise from some familiar stories. Our role play area has transformed into a hospital! We are so excited to become real life SUPERHEROES! We will update the website in the upcoming weeks to show how fabulous it looks! In Maths we will recap addition and subtraction and begin to develop our reasoning skills by solving word problems. We will also continue to work on the children's understanding and fast recall of number bonds to 5 and 10, using our outdoor area to play fun games relating to this. Our RE topic is Friendship, where we will be learning all about what makes a good friend, who our friends are and who Jesus' friends were and what Jesus and his friends liked to do together. We would like to again stress the importance of reading with your child at home, we can see the progress the children are making form reading at home, so please continue to allow your child to read their book to you or an older sibling. We would like to thank you all for your support in your child's learning during Reception.

Welcome back to the final term of Year One! We hope you all had an enjoyable and relaxing break. We have lots of fun and exciting activities planned for this last half term. Our topic in RE is 'My world Jesus world,' where the children will be exploring what life was like when Jesus was alive on earth. We will learn about the human nature and experience of Jesus as he lived in the world at that time. The children will be looking at questions such as, what style of clothes did Jesus wear? What toys did he have? Did Jesus have a mobile phone? If you could travel back in time to Jesus' world, what would you like to see? This topic will allow children to discover how the world has changed. In English this term we will be focusing on fantasy stories looking at superheroes, poetry and instructions. The children will continue to work on their punctuation, vocabulary, and presentation. If there are any opportunities for the children to practise their writing at home this would be brilliant, and will also help with their creative imaginations! In maths the children will be learning about time, multiplication, division, using number facts to add/subtract money and position and direction. We will also continue to work on our problem solving and reasoning skills. We will begin a new topic in science looking at the different seasons focusing on weather, clothes special events and months in each season. In history we will be learning all about Florence Nightingale and comparing nursing in the present day. As part of this topic we will be looking at how life has changed over the decades and comparing things such as nurses' uniform, equipment, resources and hospitals. We will also look how Britain has been influenced by the wider world.





Year 3 News

Welcome back to the last term of the school year! We hope you enjoyed your half term break and were able to enjoy the wonderful weather too! Maths will focus on the 4 operations + - x and ÷. They will learn the short, written methods for addition, multiplication and division. We will also be looking at adding and subtracting fraction amounts. Make sure you are practising your Mad Minutes at home! In English, the children will reinforce their understanding of poetry, recognising the features that are required when writing a poem. They will be introduced to Roald Dahl's play about The Witches and look at the difference in layout and dialogue writing. We will also be focussing on Poetry this term. The children will reinforce what they already know and identify the different features in a poem. In History, we will be carrying on from Spring 2 where we looked at the Roman invasion and we will understand the impact they had on our local area. The area we will be focusing on will be Chester where the Romans had a huge impact and influence. Forces and Magnets is the Science topic for this term. They will look at the properties of magnets and how they work, as well as their everyday use of forces such as pushing, pulling and twisting. In RE, we will focus on the Lord's Prayer. We will think about the meaning of each line in the prayer and consider the importance of this. The children will even write their own prayer using key vocabulary from the Lord's Prayer.



Year 4 News



Oh, my goodness! It is our final half term of Year 4 and there is lots to do! Of course, we will continue swimming and there will be the some of the usual exciting end of Year activities such as St Peter's Feast Day, Sports day and Learn, Love and Grow together Day, so watch out for news and dates of those. In RE, we begin with a new Health and Relationships unit and follow that by exploring the links between artwork and religion. In Maths, we will be completing some of the final units in measurement: area, perimeter, and converting between units of measurements. For the final few weeks will we revisit some topics and concepts that were taught earlier in the year and need some polishing, ready for Year 5. In English, we begin by looking at writing our very own Tudor information texts which link to our new History topic. We have had our exciting trip to Ordsall Hall to support our Tudor learning; the children had a fantastic time! After this, we will move on to reading and exploring 'How to Train your Dragon'. We finish the English curriculum for this year by reading and writing some nonsense poetry. Science learning explores Sound and is the second physics topic of the year. Here, we explore how sounds are made and what can affect the pitch and the volume of a sound. Finally, we truly hope that you have all enjoyed your year with the Year 4 team and we look forward to a hard but rewarding final term. Thank you for your support this year.

Year 5 News

Welcome back to our final half term of the year! In English this half term, we will begin by reading Kensuke's Kingdom by Michael Morpurgo - a wonderful story of adventure and friendship! We will be investigating settings, character development, dialogue and narrative style. We will be focusing specifically on comprehension skills and will be analysing the book. In Maths, we will start by ordering and comparing decimal numbers, and then the children will use this skill and apply it to problem solving activities, including the use of percentages and decimals. We will then move onto analysing data from graphs. Finally, we will focus on metric and imperial units. For our Science Unit, we will look at the unit of forces. We will be exploring more complex forces, building on the learning from Year 3. We will look at gravity, friction, air and water resistance and applying these to lots of fun and informative experiments. For RE we will explore multi-cultural Christianity. During this unit, we will talk and think about the first Christians and the spread of Christianity.

The children will be given a simple introduction to understanding Christianity as a multi-cultural and worldwide faith. Our topic work will move towards History, by investigating the big question 'Who were the Rochdale pioneers?' In this unit, the children will explore the beginning of the co-operative movement an how this started in our very own hometown! We will be exploring further the concepts of inequality and justice and how these interact with the social classes of Victorian Rochdale.





Welcome back to the final term of Year 6! We have lots of fun and exciting activities planned for this last half term. Over the course of this half term the children will be working extremely hard in all areas of the curriculum. This half term within RE, we will be focusing on 'Ascension and Pentecost' and sharing our thoughts as a class. The children will be answering Big Questions and posing their own. The Christian Value we will explore is 'Truthfulness'. Within English, we will be focusing on different genres of writing where the children have the opportunity to edit and redraft their work; ensuring each piece of writing shows their true potential. We start by exploring a variety of texts, focusing our attention on a variety of writing styles. To end, we will look at 'The Eighteenth Emergency' by Bets Byars, thinking about writing an alternative ending; we will also be reading the story in class and basing our writing around it. We will be using the thoughts and feelings of the characters to produce our writing. Within Maths, we will begin with place value, thinking about rounding. Then we will move onto looking at fraction and percentages of amounts. Children will be taking part in Freckles Maths and answer questions that are marked automatically and then are tested at the end. We will continue with the competition between the classes on TT Rock stars, and we will see which class wins just before the end of the year. Within science, we will be looking at electricity. Children will get the opportunity to observe how electricity works and thinking about how a circuit is formed correctly. Within History, we will be looking at modern Britain and thinking about 'How has life changed in modern Britain?'. We will be learning about important events that have happened within modern Britain and how that has changed our lives today. We want to take this opportunity to wish all the Year 6 children the very best of luck as they move on to their high schools.
